

Copyright & Takedown Claims

We value the intellectual property rights of others and encourage You to uphold this same principle. We are committed to removing User Content that infringes on the intellectual property rights of others. Additionally, we may suspend or terminate the access of any user found violating these rights.

Submitting a Copyright Infringement Notification

In accordance with Australian copyright law, if you believe your intellectual property or copyright is being infringed upon by a user of our Services, please forward your written notice to our legal department:

For a timely resolution, your notice should:

- ☐ Include your physical or electronic signature;
- ☐ Detail the copyrighted work or intellectual property believed to be infringed;
- ☐ Clearly specify the alleged infringing content to enable its identification and location;
- ☐ Provide adequate contact details, including your address, phone number, and email;
- ☐ Include a statement asserting your belief that the use of the material is not authorised by the intellectual property owner, their agent, or under Australian law;
- ☐ Confirm the accuracy of the notice's content;
- ☐ Declare, under the penalties of perjury, your authority to act on behalf of the intellectual property owner.

Please note that our legal team addresses concerns specifically related to copyright and intellectual property infringements.

Submitting a Counter-Notification

If we notify you about the removal or disabling of material you provided due to a valid copyright infringement notice, you may submit a counter-notification. This should:

- ☐ Include your physical or electronic signature;
- ☐ Specify details of the removed material and where it was initially located;
- ☐ Contain a statement asserting your belief that the removal was a result of a mistake or misidentification;
- ☐ Provide your contact details, including your address and phone number, and confirm your consent to the jurisdiction of Australian courts and agree to accept legal notice from the original notifier or their agent.

Warning Against Misuse

Misrepresentation in your notice or counter-notification, whether by falsely claiming infringement or alleging erroneous removal, can result in legal consequences under Australian law. At hsj.host, we take misuse seriously and may seek legal redress. Please ensure all requirements are met before submitting any notice.

Termination Policy

We reserve the right to terminate the accounts or access of users subject to repeated copyright or other infringement notifications.
